

## SELECTMAN'S MEETING MINUTES

July 15, 2019

- Meeting was called to order at 7:00pm
- Selectpersons present: Beverly Bradstreet, Kevin Bradstreet, Jeanie Doore
- Also present: Brian Croft, Brent Dow, Matt Lee
- It was voted on to accept the minutes of the June 10, 2019 Selectman's Meeting.
- There was a Public Hearing held on July 15, 2019 at 6:30 pm in regards to a junkyard/automobile graveyard at 65 Rustic Lane. At the hearing it was voted on to approve and accept the permit. The permit was signed at the Selectman's Meeting.
- Supplemental Property Taxes we accepted and signed for Doug and Terry Hall. \$1072.00 (penalty)
- There was discussion of KVCOG Nominations- two representatives to serve on the KVCOG General Assembly, one must be a municipal officer. Nominations to be returned by August 30, 2019.
- It was voted on to accept and sign the DOT – LRAP. \$51, 792 that must be used for major improvements.
- Fuel prices were discussed. CB Haskell would be pre-buy at \$2.489 and Waldo County Oil was budget at 2.459. It was voted on to buy fuel from Waldo County Oil on their budget plan at 2.459 per gallon.
- MMA Officer Voting Ballot was signed.
- Road Commissioner's Report: Missing and damaged signs are being replaced or put up throughout town. Inventory will be taken and more signs will be ordered if needed. A curve sign was requested on the Clark Road. There was some discussion about a speed limit sign for the Yorktown Road. We will check with the DOT. Bridge reports for

Quaker Hill and Robbins Road from the DOT were discussed. Gravel will be brought onto the Weymouth Rd, Quaker Hill.

- There was discussion of the STOP sign on the Knights Road and Harding Road intersection. Both the Road Commissioner and Selectman Jeanie Doore have been in contact with the DOT field office. After speaking with the DOT it is within the Selectman's and Road Commissioner's jurisdiction to put a Stop sign on the Knights Road. Because there has been a Stop sign at this intersection for quite a number of years and it is advised that it would be dangerous to now make a change in the type of sign and the DOT recommends to keep it a STOP sign given the topography, sight lines, and amount of traffic that comes off each off the roads.
- The next Selectman's Meeting was set for July 29, 2019 at 6:30pm in the Town Office.
- Meeting was adjourned at 7:58pm.
